**Item 1: Review minutes from the August 18, 2008 meeting with Central Utah Water Conservancy District.**

**Cory Branch**, Planning Director, went over the minutes from the August 18, 2008 Meeting with Central Utah Water Conservancy District for those in attendance.

**Item 2: As requested by Mapleton City Trails Sub-Committee Horrocks Engineering will be in attendance to discuss possible coordination efforts regarding a public trail along pipeline known as the Mapleton Springville Pipeline.**

A discussion took place in regards to gates on the west side along the pipeline canal. Cory thought there were 12-14 gates installed. The next step was to meet with Alan Christensen, to set up a meeting with Beverly in regards to the Canal Parkway Trail. The Committee asked Cory to coordinate the below items:

1. Email out the addresses to Tracy and Cathy for those property owners along the canal.
2. To coordinate what easements the government has along this area.
3. To get the Engineering Firm's name to Trails Sub-Committee that did the Canal Engineering.
4. Set up a meeting with Gary Calder, Stan Jorgensen, and Alan Christensen.
5. Touch base with the Engineering Firm that did the original engineering on the canal.

6. Set up a meeting with Lindon City to go over their trails plan on October 13, 2008 if possible.

**Stan Jorgensen**, with Horrocks Engineering, was asked to get the City an idea of the cost of the drawings, etc. in regards to the Canal Parkway Trail, which would be done in four possible phases, which are listed below:

1. First phase would be the environmental phase, depending on the source money.
2. Second phase would be the design phase.
3. Third phase would be the Right-of-Way and Easements.
4. Four phase would be the construction.

Horrocks felt they could get the Committee a written description of the phases, and a cost estimate, which will take them a couple of weeks to put together. **Rick Maingot** felt that Horrocks should keep it simple for now. The Trails Sub-Committee can start working on gaining access to the canal, so that everything is in place when the time comes that the canal can be used as a trail. **Ann Tolley** felt that the Committee should get some pictures of similar trails as examples when meeting with residents, so they can see what a positive thing it could be to have the trail along the canal. She felt that we should get more bids on the engineering as well. The Committee needs to do the bare minimum at this time due to money restraints. Rick felt that we should figure out just what we need so that additional work does not need to be done in regards to engineering, saving both time and money.

**Item 3: Canal Trail – fundraising update**

The Trails Sub-Committee would like April Houser to take care of the donations in regards to depositing them at the bank, and sending thank you letters to those that do donate. A possible fund raising idea could be a Secret Garden Tour in Mapleton. The Committee wanted to hold another meeting with Rick Bluth, which will be set up by Tracy Padgett. The Committee felt that a meeting should take place with Alan Christensen sometime in September and if possible Lindon City on October 13, 2008. Steve Olpin ([solpinfilms@yahoo.com](mailto:solpinfilms@yahoo.com) - phone 362-8940) felt that a fun ride could be a possible fund raiser, that would include not only adults, but children too. The Committee would like Steve to attend the meeting with Rick Bluth as well.

**Item 4: Forest Service – Lower Left Fork Trail progress. Additional Forest Service Projects for 2009.**

The bench will be the next Eagle Project to be done in regards to the Forest Service. There are also some clean-up projects that could take place as well all along the trail.

**Item 5: Eagle Projects to benefit the Trails in the city.**

**Tracy Padgett** felt more work could be done on the Upper Left Fork Trail in the future. Rick felt that some areas could be widened for safety purposes. Some possible grant money could be gained through Subaru, which has an International Biking Association that does grants to help with trails.

**Item 6: Master Trails Plan.**

**Cory Branch** gave a presentation on the Trails throughout the City. The Committee would like a connection between the Gibby and Roundy properties.
